SYNOPSIS

Act II finds the same characters transferred to Leydenkirk, Holland, in the year 1655. The story is built around Jaqueline who, when a baby was found unconscious on the beach following a storm. The Burgomaster took her into his home where she grew into a beautiful but irresponsible young lady. Much transpires in this small hamlet before the curtain of the second act finally closes.

Act III once again finds the whole company back in the Van der Meer home where after being awakened by the medium, they recount their dreams.
